

#### **EXHAUST SYSTEM (QR25DE)**

- If the insulator is badly deformed, repair or replace it. If deposits such as mud pile up on the insulator, remove them.
- When installing the insulator avoid large gaps or interference between the insulator and each exhaust
- Remove deposits from the sealing surface of each connection. Connect them securely to avoid gas leak-
- Temporarily tighten the exhaust manifold side mounting nuts and the vehicle side mounting bolts. Check each part for unusual interference, and then tighten them to the specified torque.
- When installing each mounting rubber, avoid twisting or unusual extension in up/down and right/left directions.
- Insert the seal bearing in the direction as shown. Tighten the mounting bolt with the big end of the spring facing the flange.

Tighten the mounting bolt without causing interference with the flange.




