- When installing rubber bushings, the final tightening must be carried out under unladen conditions with tires on ground. Spilled oil might shorten the life of rubber bushings. Be sure to wipe off any spilled oil.
- Unladen conditions mean that fuel, engine coolant and lubricant are full. Spare tire, jack, hand tools and mats are in designated positions.
- After servicing suspension parts, be sure to check wheel alignment.
- Self-lock nuts are not reusable. Always use new ones when installing. Since new self-lock nuts are pre-oiled, tighten as they are.


Ball Joint Axial End Play

Move axle side of suspension arm in the axial direction by hand. Check there is no end play.

Axial end play : Refer to RSU-23, "Ball Joint".

CAUTION:

- Never depress brake pedal when measuring.
- Never perform with tires on level ground.
- Be careful not to damage ball joint boot. Never damage the installation position by applying excessive force.



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SHOCK ABSORBER

Check for oil leakage and damage. Replace it if necessary.

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WHEEL ALIGNMENT

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DESCRIPTION

Measure wheel alignment under unladen conditions.

NOTE:

"Unladen conditions" means that fuel, engine coolant, and lubricant are full. Spare tire, jack, hand tools and mats are in designated positions.

PRELIMINARY CHECK

Check the following:

- Tires for improper air pressure and wear. Refer to WT-62, "Tire Air Pressure".
- · Road wheels for runout.
- Wheel bearing axial end play. Refer to <u>RAX-6, "Inspection"</u>.
- Ball joint axial end play of suspension arm. Refer to RSU-5, "Inspection".
- Shock absorber operation.
- Each mounting point of axle and suspension for looseness and deformation.
- Each of front lower link, rear lower link, toe control link (without 4WAS), 4WAS rear actuator (with 4WAS), rear suspension member, suspension arm and shock absorber for cracks, deformation, and other damage.
- Vehicle height (posture).

GENERAL INFORMATION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- A four-wheel thrust alignment should be performed.
- This type of alignment is recommended for any NISSAN/INFINITI vehicle.
- The four-wheel "thrust" process helps ensure that the vehicle is properly aligned and the steering wheel is centered.
- The alignment rack itself should be capable of accepting any NISSAN/INFINITI vehicle.
- The rack should be checked to ensure that it is level.
- · Make sure the machine is properly calibrated.
- Your alignment equipment should be regularly calibrated in order to give correct information.
- Check with the manufacturer of your specific equipment for their recommended Service/Calibration Schedule.

ALIGNMENT PROCESS

IMPORTANT:

Use only the alignment specifications listed in this Service Manual.

- When displaying the alignment settings, many alignment machines use "indicators": (Green/red, plus or minus, Go/No Go). Never use these indicators.
- The alignment specifications programmed into your machine that operate these indicators may not be correct.
- This may result in an ERROR.
- Most camera-type alignment machines are equipped with both "Rolling Compensation" method and optional "Jacking Compensation" method to "compensate" the alignment targets or head units. "Rolling Compensation" is the preferred method.
- If using the "Rolling Compensation" method, after installing the alignment targets or head units, push or pull on the rear wheel to move the vehicle. **Do not push or pull on the vehicle body.**
- If using the "Jacking Compensation" method, after installing the alignment targets or head units, raise the vehicle and rotate the wheels 1/2 turn both ways.

NOTE:

Do not use the "Rolling Compensation" method if you are using sensor-type alignment equipment.

Follow all instructions for the alignment machine you're using for more information.

 Perform final tightening of rear suspension member and axle installation position (rubber bushing), under unladen conditions with tires on level ground.


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INSPECTION AFTER REMOVAL

Removal and Installation

REMOVAL

- Perform adjustment before removal. (With 4WAS) Refer to RSU-22, "Inspection and Adjustment".
- Remove tires with power tool. Refer to <u>WT-56, "Exploded View"</u>.
- Remove caliper assemblies. Hang caliper assembly in a place where it will not interfere with work. Refer to BR-57, "BRAKE CALIPER ASSEMBLY (1 PISTON TYPE): Removal and Installation" (1 piston type), BR-61, "BRAKE CALIPER ASSEMBLY (2 PISTON TYPE): Removal and Installation" (2 piston type). **CAUTION:**

Avoid depressing brake pedal while brake caliper is removed.

- Remove disc rotor. Refer to RAX-8, "Removal and Installation".
- Remove main muffler. Refer to EX-6, "VQ37VHR: Removal and Installation" (VQ37VHR), EX-7, "VK56VD: Removal and Installation" (VK56VD).
- Remove member stay and rear final drive assembly. Refer to <u>DLN-170, "Removal and Installation"</u> (VQ37VHR), DLN-208, "Removal and Installation" (VK56VD).
- Remove drive shaft. Refer to RAX-13, "Removal and Installation".
- 8. Separate rear cable from front cable, and then remove rear cable from rear suspension member. Refer to PB-6, "Removal and Installation".
- Remove wheel sensor and sensor harness from rear suspension member. Refer to BRC-138, "REAR WHEEL SENSOR: Removal and Installation".
- 10. Disconnect height sensor harness connector. Refer to EXL-116, "Removal and Installation" (with AFS).

- 11. Remove shock absorber from axle housing. Refer to RSU-8, "Removal and Installation".
- 12. Set suitable jack under rear suspension member.

CAUTION:

- 13. Remove rear under cover from rear suspension member stay. Refer to EXT-29, "REAR UNDER COVER: Removal and Installation".
- 14. Remove rear suspension member stay.
- 15. Remove rear suspension member mounting nuts.
- 16. Slowly lower jack, then remove rear suspension member, suspension arms, front lower links, wheel hub and housings from vehicle as a unit.

CAUTION:

Operate while checking that jack supporting status is stable.

- 17. Remove mount stopper from rear suspension member.
- 18. Remove height sensor from suspension arm (left side). Refer to EXL-116, "Removal and Installation" (with AFS).
- 19. Remove toe control link from rear suspension member. Refer to RSU-18, "Removal and Installation" (without 4WAS).
- 20. Remove 4WAS rear actuator assembly from rear suspension member. Refer to STC-176, "Removal and Installation" (with 4WAS).
- Remove suspension arms, front lower link, rear lower link, and axle housing from rear suspension member.
- 22. Perform inspection after removal. Refer to RSU-22, "Inspection and Adjustment".

INSTALLATION

Note the following, and install in the reverse order of the removal.

- Perform final tightening of rear suspension member installation position (rubber bussing), under unladen conditions with tires on level ground.
- Perform inspection after installation. Refer to RSU-22, "Inspection and Adjustment".

Check rear suspension member for deformation, cracks, or any other damage. Replace if necessary.

INSPECTION AFTER INSTALLATION

- 2. Adjust parking brake operation (stroke). Refer to PB-3, "Inspection and Adjustment".



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
